South Devon bioregion: bounded by water




The 2024 South Hams Climate Adaptation Learning Journey


During the first week in June 2024 we gathered evidence of how farmers, communities, town councils and others are already adapting, and what is needed to grow future resilience.

Year Two of Climate Adaptation in South Devon: 2025

BLC provides leadership and collaborative action for a joined-up Adaptation Strategy

Convene a round table of stakeholders and experts including SHDC Council Members and Officers, to discuss the scope and delivery of a South Devon Climate Adaptation Strategy and Framework.

Establish a core team for the Climate Adaptation Strategy in which the District Council plays a key role, but that sits outside the Council and is politically neutral. The strategy is held by the stakeholders, advised by experts. BLC will host the secretariat

Organise and deliver four sector-specific workshops that focus on actions needed for adaptation: food, water, health and livelihoods

Lead first steps for a public-facing communication platform for Climate Adaptation. The concept of Adaptation needs explaining and the practical reality needs showcasing for a range of audiences.

Establish monitoring and evaluation of the Strategy from the get go.
