

Slow movement on policy from government

Requires investment in longterm planning, tricky to convince higher level commitment







Continued austerity for public bodies who are on their knees financially and capacity

Less resource and increased pressure on funding for statutory work in a LA. Some lead Cllrs are climate deniers.

Lagging and decreasing central government responsibility

Distractions - wars, economic crises

Lack of skills/knowledge to join up multidisciplinary action

Such a complex and multivariable issue. Difficult to know what is the priority. The more we know, the more we realise we need to do. Challenges between central government and local gov (councils)

Need to refocus of being proactive and not reactive







There are no short term fixes

Lack of clear guidance on adaptation indicators


