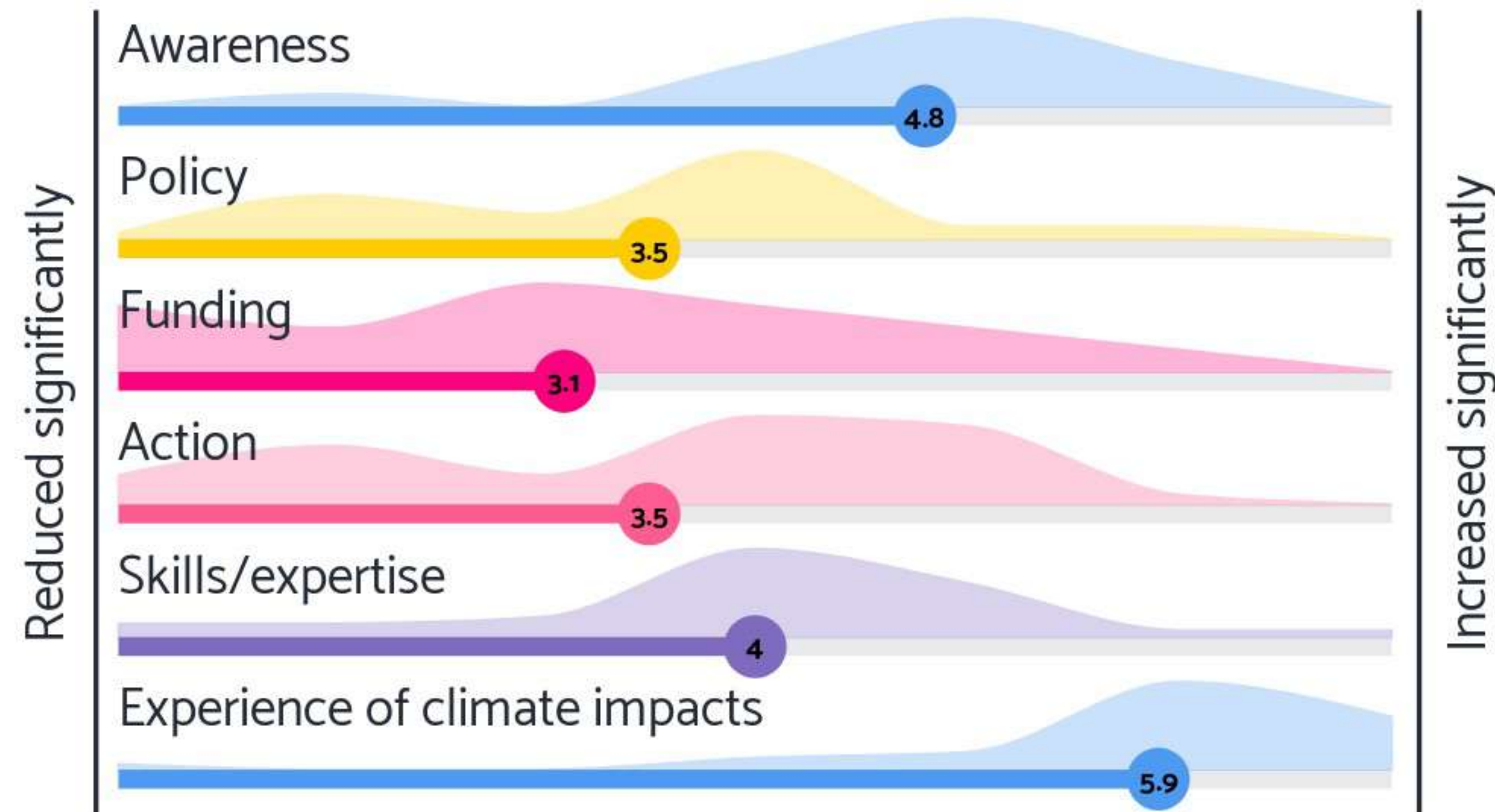

What has made it harder?

Mental health

Complexity seems to keep growing, requiring more and more voices to understand the issues and opportunities

Environment Agency cuts

More AI media misinformation

Shorter purse strings and short term financial targets

Increasing weight given to mitigation over adaptation

Slow movement on policy from government

Requires investment in long-term planning, tricky to convince higher level commitment

What has made it harder?

Continued austerity for public bodies who are on their knees financially and capacity

Less resource and increased pressure on funding for statutory work in a LA. Some lead Cllrs are climate deniers.

Lagging and decreasing central government responsibility

Distractions - wars, economic crises

Lack of skills/knowledge to join up multidisciplinary action

Such a complex and multi-variable issue. Difficult to know what is the priority. The more we know, the more we realise we need to do.

Challenges between central government and local gov (councils)

Need to refocus of being proactive and not reactive

Burn out

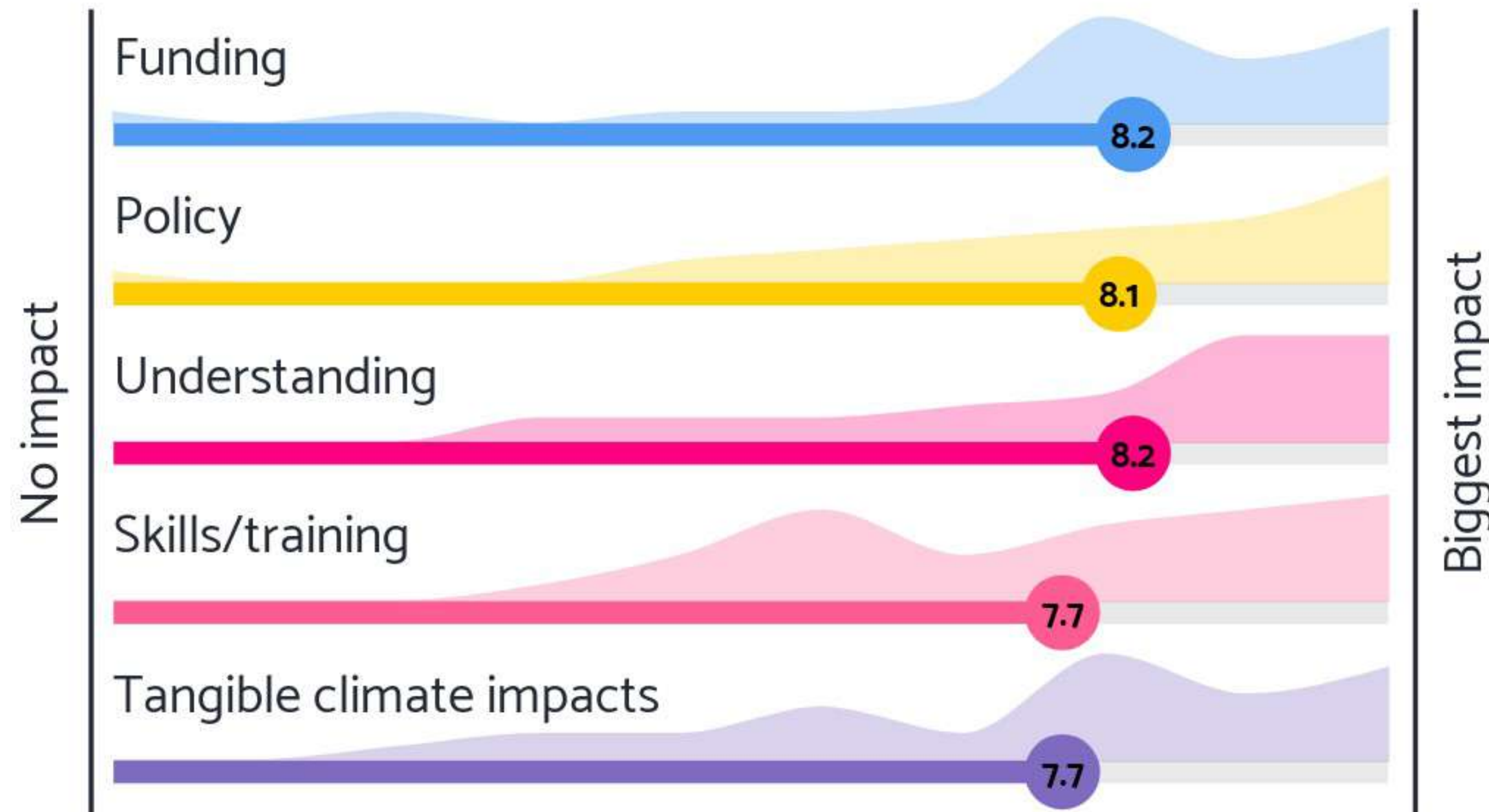
Lord Frost being made a member of the climate group within the HoL?!
