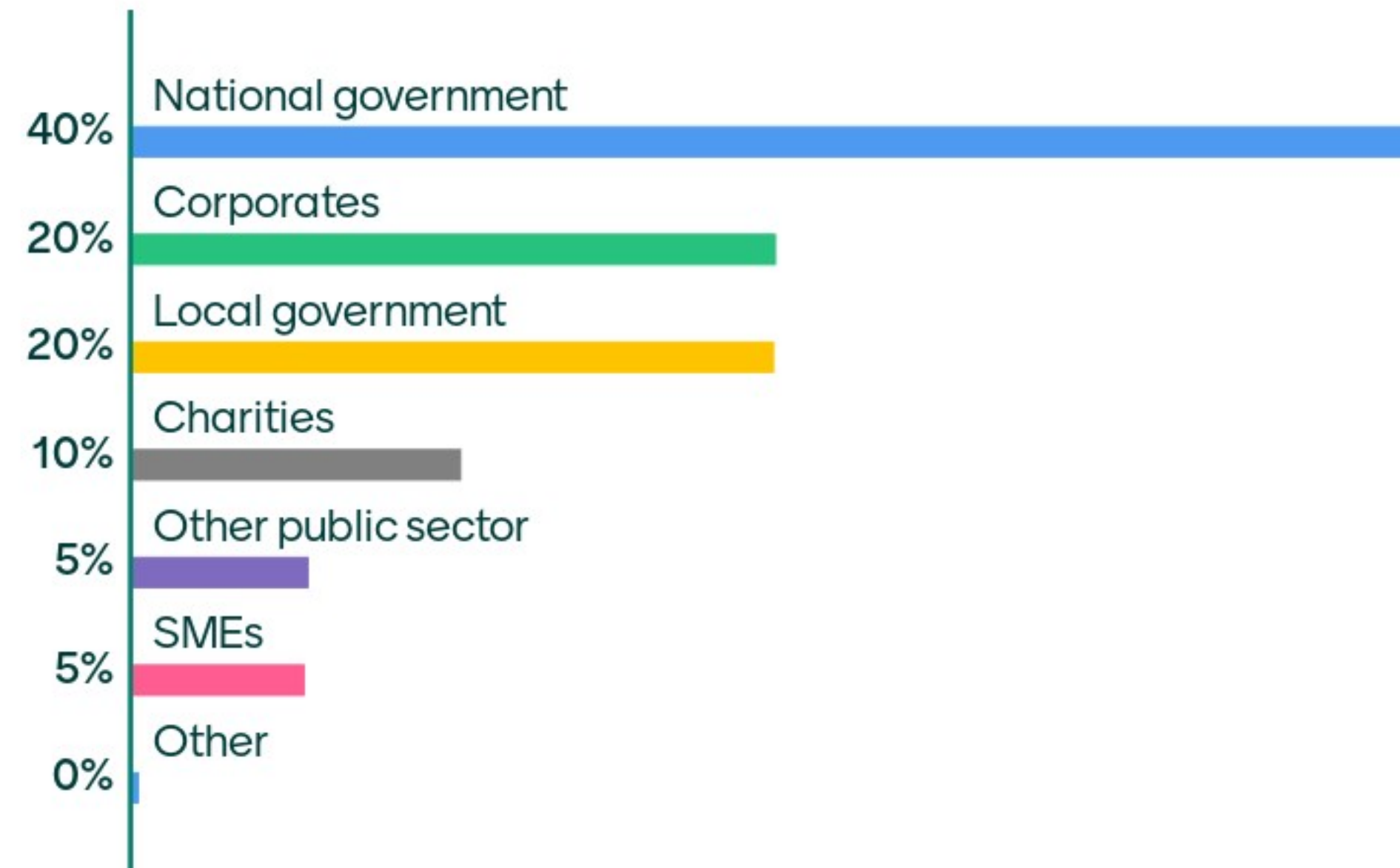

Good news - but legal processes always seem to take a long time.

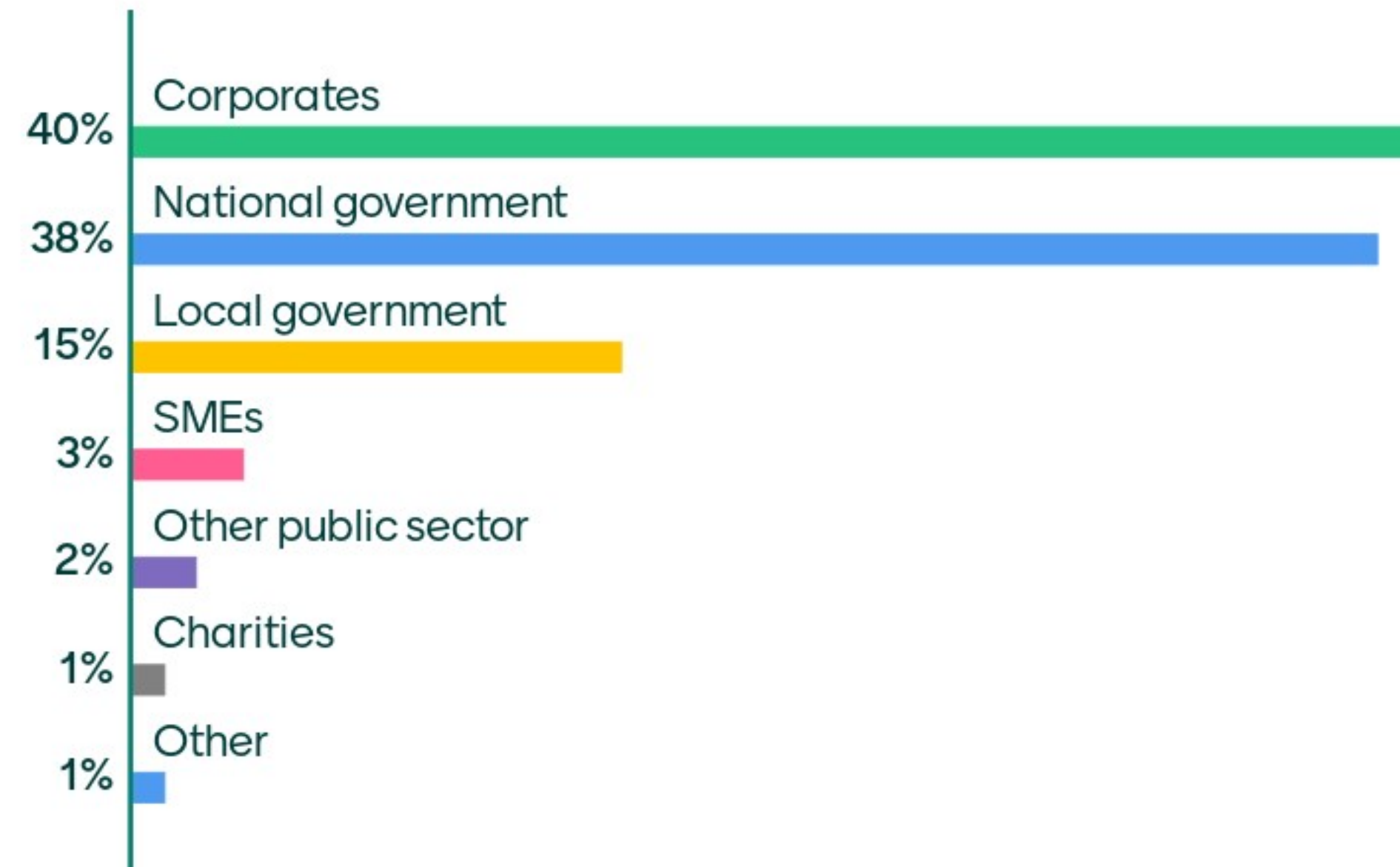

# What type of organisations do you think are more susceptible to being held accountable for climate inaction?

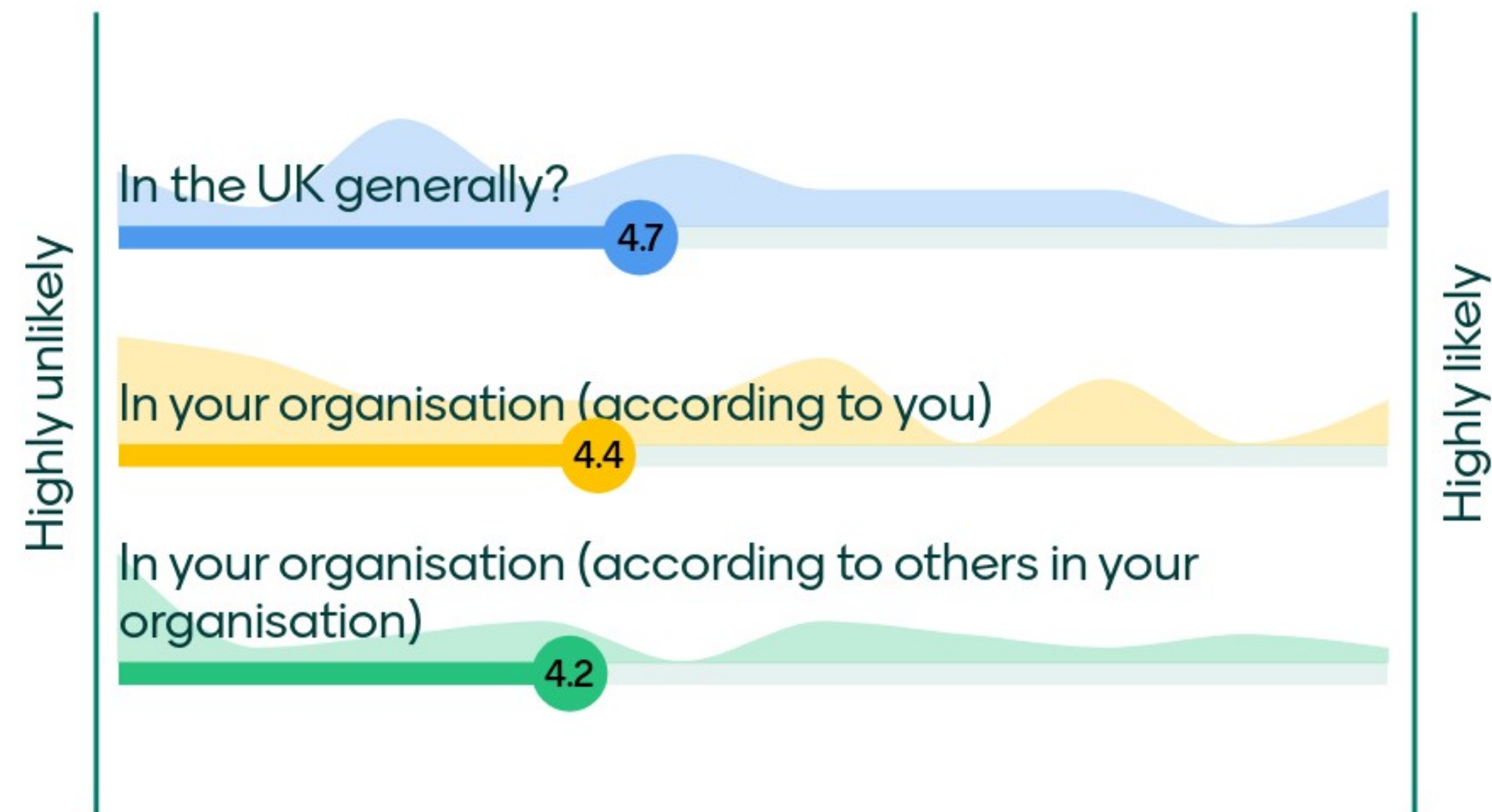




# What type of organisations do you think should be more susceptible to being held accountable for climate inaction?

# What do you think would change in your organisation if a similar organisation was held legally accountable for climate inaction?
