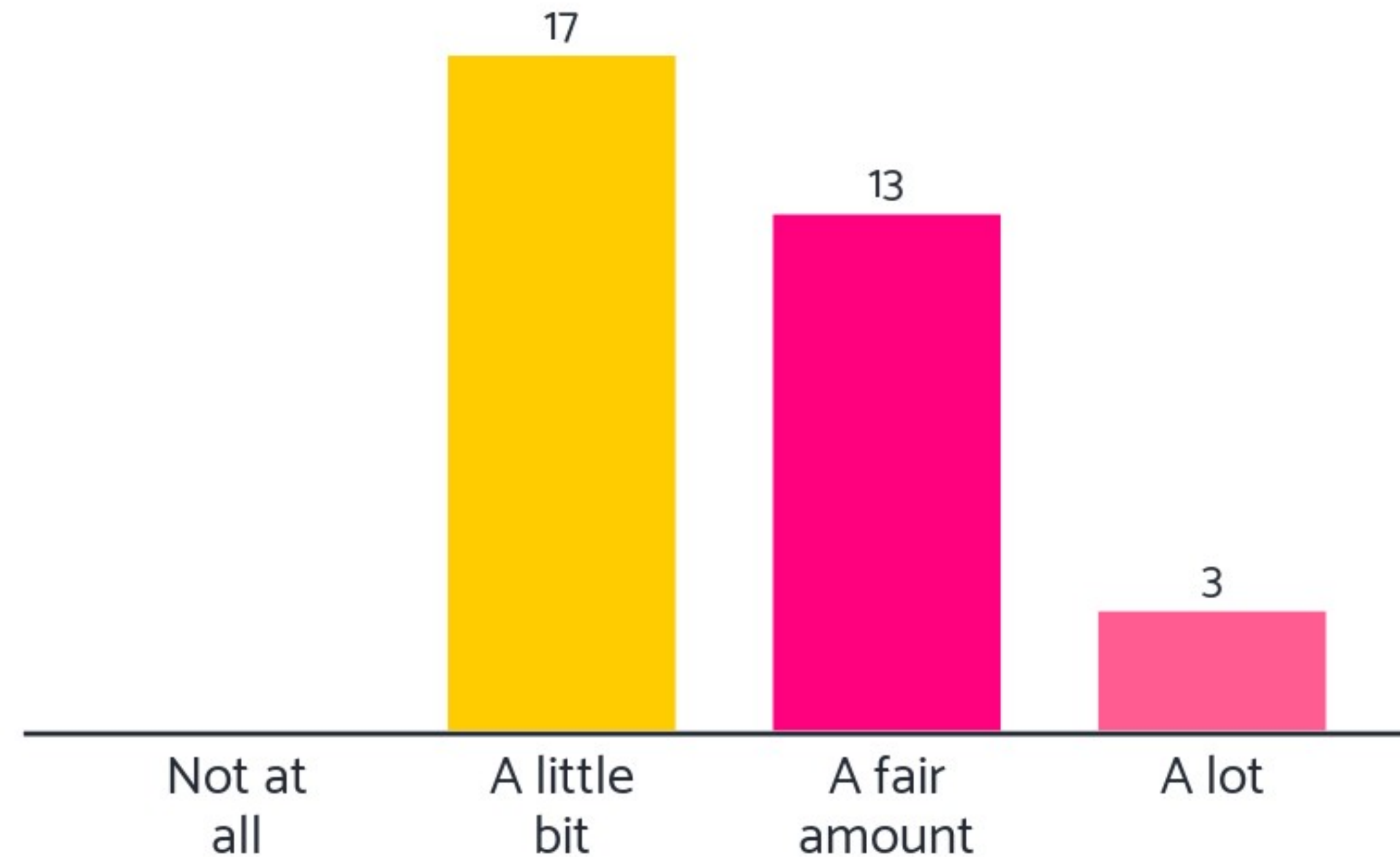

What would Just Adaptation look like in the place(s) you work in?

Solutions designed without wider participation.

lack of awareness of need to adapt

Resource and powers to address structural inequality

limited understanding that hard won development gains are being eroded. Thus not focusing on most vulnerable to adaptation.

Distribution of Resource

Lack of resource (financial, time and expertise..) to properly integrate a justice angle within adaptation

Lack of funding.

lack of long term planning and funding

What would Just Adaptation look like in the place(s) you work in?

Political priorities, old orthodoxies

recognition that many face structural barriers to keeping warm and keeping cool

Hardest to reach residents are most vulnerable

lack of understanding of what adaptation is needed

local knowledge devalued

capacity, insight, funding, life stage

Lack of tailored of information. Lack of resourcing. Top down approaches. Very wide time ranges for impacts from scientific community.

gaining the views of a cross section of the community

What would Just Adaptation look like in the place(s) you work in?

Poor join up across policy areas - poor housing, low income, vulnerability, etc

Competing pressures - need for more green space in certain parts of the city but also need for housing etc

old infrastructure

lack of infrastructure investment

old building and housing stock which has been poorly maintained

What are some of the barriers to Just Adaptation, from your perspective?

Lack of understanding of complexity

It is defined by those outside the community

Lack of community interconnectedness

Lacks stories of what it will be like for me

reaching disconnected/disengaged communities

Too busy pulling people out of the water to figure out why they're falling in

Experts seen to have the answers and don't talk to the communities in most need of adaptation

Narrative technical not empathetic
